In Brazil there are more than 15,000 ISP (Internet Providers)

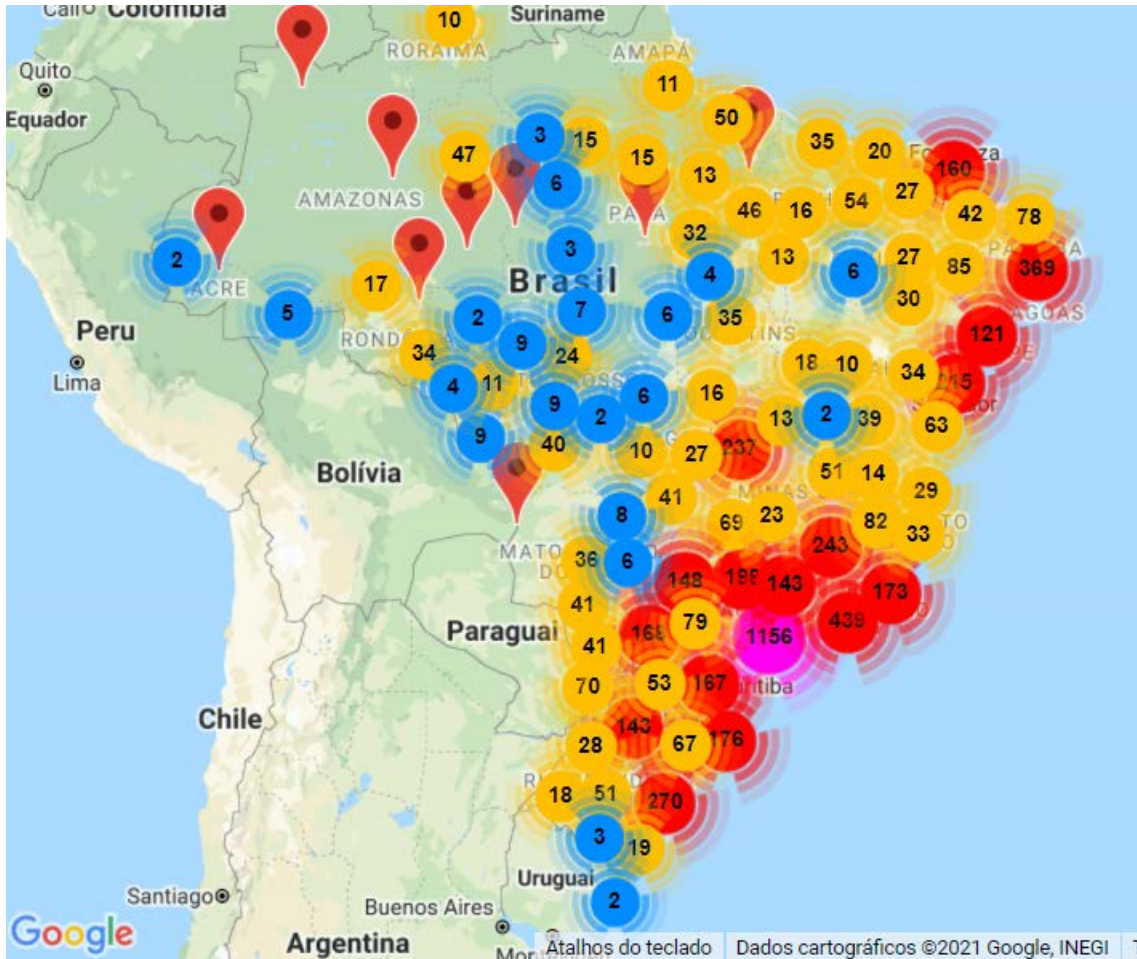
85% have less than 5,000 users

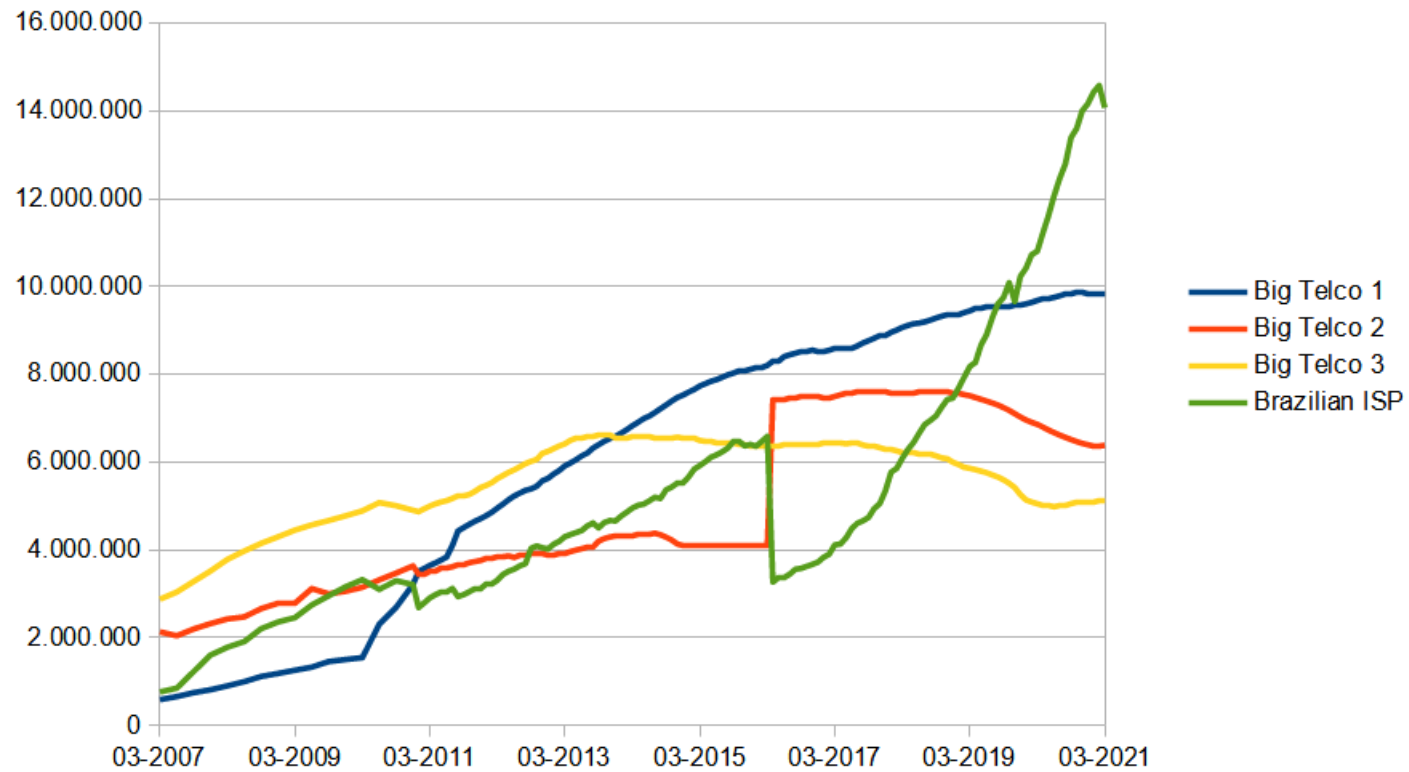

Market share (big telcos x ISPs)



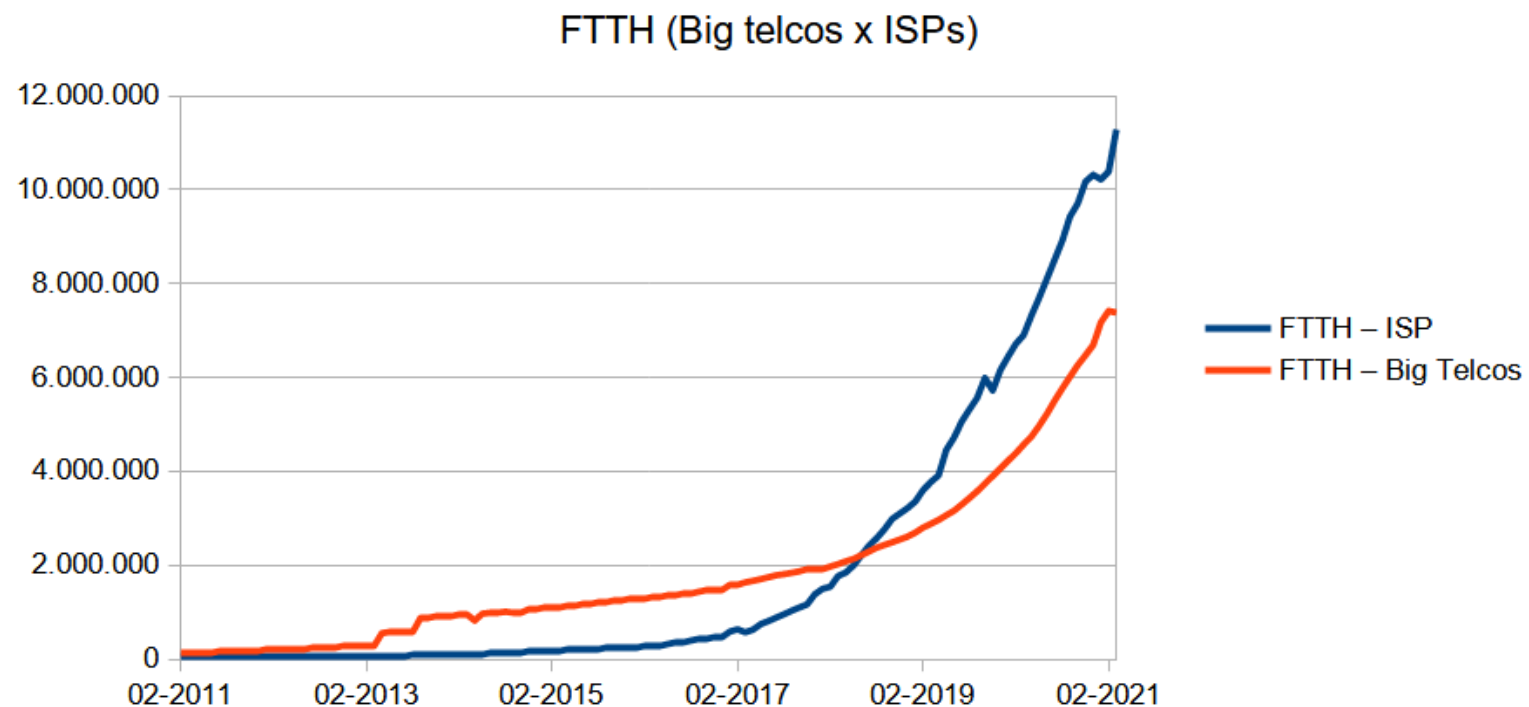
